## June

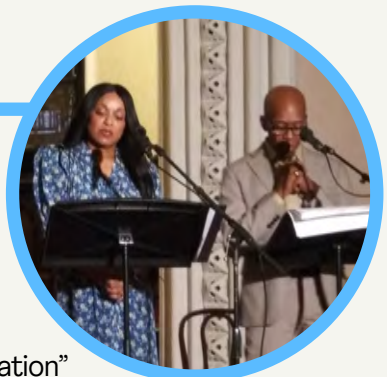
Juneteenth
