2022 PRIORITIES

I Am Trenton Community Foundation was established by a group of Trentonians in 2007 to *Make Trenton even better through community engagement, building pride in our city, and community-focused giving.* Since 2010, we have given out over \$500,000 in funding to grassroots initiatives and projects. We believe in putting resources on the ground and investing in Trenton's own changemakers. The majority of projects we fund are designed, led, and executed by Trentonians to address issues or opportunities in their own community.

Our 2023 citywide grant cycle will support ideas that address equity, social justice, resilience, and community improvement. We will interpret these categories broadly - we just ask that you pick the one that best fits your project:

- **Equity and social justice:** Initiatives that address an equity or social justice problem, organize those affected, challenge the causes, bring new awareness, cause discomfort, and/or create pressure for change.
- **Resilience:** Initiatives that improve organizations or communities' ability to deal with disruptions like the pandemic, economic crisis, climate change, etc.
- **Community Improvement:** Projects that improve a specific issue or challenge in the applicant's community.

GRANT AMOUNTS

Applicants may request up to \$5,000. We expect most grants to be between \$1,000 to \$3,000.

WHO CAN APPLY

We will prioritize projects designed and led by Trenton residents, people of color, and people with lived experience of the issue the project is addressing. Applicants are not required to have 501(c)3 nonprofit status. However, please note that grant funds are considered taxable income by the State of New Jersey and the IRS unless the recipient entity is tax-exempt. We also require a W9 with either an EIN or SSN to issue each grant. Grant recipients are responsible for all income reporting and all associated tax payments. We strongly encourage applicants who do not have 501(c)3 status to partner with a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that can serve as a fiscal sponsor for the project.

I Am Trenton reserves the right to disqualify an applicant that has not submitted satisfactory reports or complied with grant requirements in our other grant cycles. If you currently have an open grant, please talk to us (grants@iamtrenton.org) before applying.

HOW TO APPLY

The full application appears below. All applications must be submitted through the online form at <u>https://www.iamtrenton.org/citywide</u>. We will not accept emailed or mailed applications.

In keeping with our goals to become more inclusive:

- We will accept applications in Spanish as well as English.
- Applicants have the option of submitting their Project Details as a short essay OR as a short video. Please see the application for details.

The deadline is July 31, 2023, at 11:59 pm.

WE DO NOT FUND

- Projects or organizations that discriminate on the basis of age, race, gender, national origin, ethnicity, veteran status, sexual orientation, gender identity, or disability.
- Debt reduction or on-going operational support
- Capital campaigns or fundraising events
- Re-granting programs
- Scholarships
- Partisan political activities, lobbying, or efforts to influence an election
- Religious activities such as worship, religious instruction, or proselytizing. Religious organizations can apply for non-denominational activities that are open to all and do not require participation in religious services.

- **3. Notification of awards -** We expect to notify applicants on whether their application was funded or not by September 15, 2023.
- 4. Grant activities should occur between October 1, 2023 and September 30, 2024.

REVIEW PROCESS

Applications will be reviewed by the Citywide Grants Committee, which includes I Am Trenton board members and volunteer community members. Reviewers will score each application individually, then discuss all the applications in the pool. We do our best to fund projects at the amount requested, but we may approve a grant for a lower amount.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANTEES

If your project is funded, you should expect the following

Grant Agreement and W9: Grantees will be required to sign a grant agreement with I Am Trenton Community Foundation. For applicants with a fiscal sponsor, the grant agreement will be between IAT and the fiscal sponsor. We also require a signed W9 form with an EIN or SSN to issue each grant.

Please note that projects over \$2,000 will receive two installments of funding: one at the start of the project, and the second after a progress report due no later than March 31, 2024 (see below).

Kickoff meeting / award ceremony: We will organize a grantee convening at which grantees can receive their checks and meet each other in late September 2023. Grantees will receive information directly.

Reporting: Grantees will be required to report on their progress by **March 31, 2023**, either by phone/virtual meeting or in a short written report. A final written report will be due by **October 15, 2024.** We ask that grantees document project activities through photos, short videos, etc. and submit these with their reports. Grantees will receive instructions on how to submit their reports directly.
